





Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour! It gives me great joy to connect with you through this consolidated issue of CrossTalk, now presented in a new format with larger print for easier reading.

As we celebrate our forthcoming Annual Thanksgiving Service on 12th October 2025, my heart is filled with gratitude for the unfailing mercies of our Lord. Time and again, He has blessed us, sustained us, and led us faithfully, and this season offers us another opportunity to return thanks to Him.

This year, our Harvest theme: "Gratitude for God's Bountiful Blessings" reminds us that thanksgiving is more than a yearly tradition; the Scripture. In Leviticus, chapter 27, verse 30, we



read,

"Every tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the trees, is the LORD's; it is holy to the LORD".

This commandment was given to the people of the Hebrews so that they can invoke the attitude of gratitude and the resources that is collected can be used for the welfare of the people, i.e. to help the poor and needy.

Formulation of the Nicene Creed - 1700 years ago!

created and interacted with the physical realm, with Jesus being seen as more of an intermediary than as God himself.

One individual influenced by this philosophy was Arius, a prominent elder in the Church of Alexandria. Bishop Alexander of Alexandria opposed Arius's views and sought to remove him from his position. Arius's respected moral character and teaching abilities had significant support in Alexandria, leading to the rise of Arianism, which denied the full divinity of Jesus Christ and advocated for the theory of Subordinationism—the belief that the Son is subordinate to the Father. In response, Athanasius and other orthodox theologians defended the belief that the Son is of "one substance with the Father" to uphold the essence of Christian truth.


Meanwhile, Constantine, a military leader, who became the Roman Emperor of both the Western and Eastern part of the Roman Empire, had also embraced Christianity, sought to unify the Empire by uniting the Church. Learning of doctrinal divisions within the Church, he convened the First Ecumenical Council in Nicaea in 325 AD, inviting over three hundred bishops to settle the controversies. The council resulted in

the formulation of statements of faith, known as the Nicene Creed, which affirmed the divinity of Christ and his equality with the Father. The Nicene Creed was later revised in the Ecumenical Councils of Constantinople and Chalcedon, eventually becoming known as the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed and serving as the foundation of Orthodox Christian belief.

To commemorate the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Council, Christians worldwide are organizing Ecumenical lectures and events involving clergy and laity to emphasize unity against heresies. The Karnataka Central Diocese also hosted a Colloquium on 27.09.25 titled "Nicene Pilgrimage: Paradigms, Perspectives, and Provocations" in honour of this historic occasion.

About the Diocesan Colloquium

Along with Rev. Navin K. John, our delegation at this event included Mr. Dominic Manuel, Mrs. Shalom Roger, Mr. Prashanth Manoj, and Ms. Neha Nathania. In his opening address, the Bishop reminded us of the enduring significance of the Nicene Creed—a declaration of our faith in Christ and the Triune God: Father, Son, & the Holy Spirit. ■



The Church endured persecution for over three centuries until 313 AD when it gained Imperial favour and protection. The Edict of Milan was proclaimed, allowing the practice and spread of the Christian faith throughout the Roman Empire. As Christianity expanded, it began to influence and be influenced by Greek philosophy. Some Christians started to perceive God in a similar manner to the philosophers' concept of a perfect, unchangeable deity, distinct from flawed humans and the material world. This led to the belief that angels, acting as intermediaries,

The year began with a thought-provoking session by Mr. Prashanth Manoj, who encouraged the youth to set Christ-centered goals using the S.M.A.R.T approach, drawing inspiration from the life of Noah. February saw the group gather for a powerful workshop on Finding Our Identity in Christ, followed by an uplifting fellowship meal. Soon after, the youth engaged in an outreach visit to St. John's Boys Hostel
